## Who will you be listening to?

### Listening squawks

Listening squawks are in use around specific airspace. They allow an air traffic controller to alert a pilot if their aircraft looks likely to infringe. Relevant codes are published in UK AIP ENR 1.6.2.2.5 under SSR Operating Procedures. Up to date codes and frequencies are also available from: [airspacesafety.com/listen/](http://airspacesafety.com/listen/)

### How to listen out

- Select the listening squawk, using ALT (Mode C) if you have it
- Listen out on the appropriate frequency without transmitting
- Change to code 7000 when you leave the area or change frequency

### Remember

#### A listening squawk does NOT

- allow you to enter controlled airspace
- mean you are receiving an ATC service

#### 8.33 kHz changes

Pilots are to refer to the AIP supplement and associated NOTAM to check 8.33 kHz changes before each flight.
